The North West Swimming Club

The swimming pool at Ostan na Rosann is being made available to the North-Western region on a long-term lease. The pool would be run by a committee representing the interest and safety of the community that wishes to use it. The County Council are willing and prepared to help out if a voluntary contribution is forthcoming locally. A sum of \$6,000 is needed basically to get the venture off the ground.

If you are willing to have a say in this contribution it is suggested that a voluntary sum of fl per family, individual, club, association, etc. be submitted. On behalf of the Treasurer, contributions can be collected by any of the acting committee or through school principals/headmasters. Contributions can also be sent by direct post to: Donal Johnson, Hon. Treasurer, Meenmore, Dungloe. It would be helpful if contributions would be accompanied by a list of the number of interested persons in a family, club, association, etc. or the name of any individual subscriber. An early responce will be appreciated.

In February 1981, "Guth 7 Tuairim" carried this story on it's front page. It was welcome news in the area because although there are miles of sandy beaches here in the North-West, the sea is usually too cold for swimming in, except during a few short Summer months. The heated indoor swimming pool in Ostan na Rosann, Dungloe would enable swimming enthusiasts to take to the water all year round and more importantly, it could be used by schools to teach the children of the area to swim. (Incredibly, only about half our children can swim).

The North West Swimming Club was formed well over a year ago and it's committee approached Ostan na Rosann about the lease of it's swimming pool, which had been closed for many years. It was not profitable for the Ostán to keep the pool open after the huge increases in the price of oil (used for heating) from 1973 onwards. The Swimming Club also started a campaign to raise the £6,000 needed to get the pool operational again and many schools, businesses and individuals paid into the fund.

But now, well over a year later there is no sign of the pool opening and people are demanding to know where the delay is. A spokesman for the Swimming Club told "Guth 7 Tuairim" this week that the hold-up was due to the refusal of Ostán na Rosann to agree to a long-term lease for the pool. He said a very able committee had been formed to run the pool for the community, they received backing from the County Council and over £3,000 had been raised but that Ostán na Rosann would not grant them a long-term lease. He said they could not possibly spend thousands of pounds renovating the pool without the lease and although negotiations had been going on there was no word of an agreement being reached. He said they were annoyed and disappointed that nothing had come of their efforts and at the moment we had the ridiculous situation of youth clubs in this area having to travel to the pool in Letterkenny for swimming lessons.

We contacted Ostan na Rosann and a spokesman for them agreed that the delay in opening the pool was due to the failure of the two parties to come to an agreement on the lease. He maintained that the sort of lease being sought by the Swimming Club would give them virtual custody of the pool. Nobody would be more pleased to see the pool open than them and it definitely had a tremendous potential but they (Ostan) obviously needed some protection as well. He also pointed out that the funds collected were in the possession of the Swimming Club and none of these were lodged with the Ostan.

The spokesman however told "Guth 7 Tuairim" that there would definitely be some movement on the issue within the next few weeks and if it was at all feasible, the pool would be opening.



"We resent the aggression of the Dublin government towards the people of Tory and we are demanding that they remove all dole men from the island or face the consequence". This was the statement issued by the Prime Minister of Rockall Mr. Hadda Parte to the world's press last night. Observers close to Mr. Parte said he was referring to the fact that there are a large number of dole men on Tory Island. The minister for Social Welfare is adamant that "these men are only drawing their rightful share of unemployment benefit like the rest of the country". But the inhabitants of Rockall point out that the dole is the only connection the Torymen have with Ireland apart from voting a few times a year. The Rockallians claim the dole is being paid to establish a political link with Tory. They say that as Tory is nearer to Rockall than to Dublin the island is rightfully theirs.

There were ugly scenes last night in the Rockall Parliament and the majority group, the Puffin Party were pelted with eggs by the opposition Gull Party. Mr. Parte claimed that he had "layed" claim to the island of Tory on behalf of the Gull Party (then known as the Fine Gull Party), as far back as anyone could remember. Mr. Lefty Puffin Dublin Bay Rockall on behalf of the Paffin Party said he was loyal to the island people from pre-decimal days. He was shouted down with cries of foreigner and awk ! awk !

Meanwhile this morning Tory Island lay in an uneasy calm. The landing craft lay beached below the village and there was the usual display of donkey carts on standby.
