# SEWAGE SCANDAL

#### Carrickfinn Sewage Scandal

In the past few years we have had controversy surrounding various dumps in this locality. And it seems that the authorities have as yet to find a suitable method and place for waste disposal, especially the disposal of sewage refuse, as the letter below from a Carrickfinn reader illustrates.

"The authorities responsible for the dumping of raw sewage beside the airstrip at Carrickfinn must think the people of the area are right "mugs". This disgusting venture was abandoned after a very strong protest and the sewage which was spread over the grass was lifted again by officials of the guilty party. If it is such a good fertilizer I wonder would they have any objection to having it dumped in their own back yards.

Let's hope they don't try a stunt like this again and that they will show some respect for the people of the area and for the scenic beauty of the Carrickfinn/ Braade area."

# Dungloe SWIMMING POOL

Swimming Fool Saga Continues

The swimming pool in Ostán na Rosann, Dungloe (the only heated one in the area) has closed again after being re-opened to the public for a brief few months during the Junner. It now seems that the North est Swimming Association which collected a lot of money from schools, businesses and individuals, and which have been seeking for a long time to lease the pool will not in fact be doing so, and if the pool is to open again it will be operated by Ostan na Rosann themselves.

There is considerable annoyance locally by members of the public who have paid money a long time ago and who do not see any signs of getting a return for it.

Certain groups - including a Dungloe Youth Club have also complained that although they offered to pay the quoted price for an hourly session the pool was still not made available to them. Ironically, some groups are again travelling the long journey to Letterkenny swimming pool every week.

We spoke to the hotel Manager who told us that unfortunately because of the high cost of heating the pool they would need to have at least four groups per day using the pool to justify opening it. He said that some schools in the area had been approached to see if they would be interested but that they had not yet got a firm enough response from enough interested parties. He was optimistic however that the pool could open by January.

Let's hope he's right. A swimming pool is vitally important to this community.



Pat O'Donnell was hanged in London on 23rd November, 1883).

My name is Fat O'Donnell and I come from Donegal, I am, you know, a deadly foe to traitors one and all; For the shooting of James Carey I was tried in London town, And on the fatal scaffold, my life I must lay down.

I sailed on board the ship Melrose in August 'eighty-three, Among'st the cabin passengers he was on board with me. I found out he was Carey, we had some angry words and blows, The villian swore to take my life aboard the ship Melrose.

I stood awhile in my own defence to fight before I'd die, A pocket pistol I drew out, and at him I let fly; I fired at him a second time, and pierced his treacherous heart, I gave him another volley boys, before he did depart.

And as he was bleeding on the floor, in the cabin where he lay, Carey's wife and son came in which filled them with dismay, "O'Donnell, you shot my husband," Mrs. Carey loud did cry; "Yes, I did, but in self-defence, kind madam," then said I.

The captain had me handcuffed and in strong arms bound, To hand me up a prisoner when I would reach Capetown; I was taken back to London, my trial I was to stand, And prosecutors for the Crown were Carey's wife and son.

Three times the jury disagreed, but guilty found at last, The jury found me guilty and the judge my sentence passed: "For the shooting of James Carey, O'Donnell, you must die, and on the twenty-third November upon those gallows high."

I wish I was a free man and could live another year, I would make all traitors and informers, I would make them shake with fear;

And as St. Fatrick banished the serpents from our saintly lands, I would make them run before me, like the hare before the hound.

Goodbye to dear old Donegal, the place where I was born, And likewise to the U.S.A. where I was never to be scorned; Goodbye to dear old Ireland, her hills and valleys green, For never more on Erin's shore O'Donnell will be seen.
