This disgusting venture was abandoned after a very strong protest and the sewage which was spread over the grass was lifted again by officials of the guilty party. If it is such a good fertilizer I wonder would they have any objection to having it dumped in their own back yards.

Let's hope they don't try a stunt like this again and that they will show some respect for the people of the area and for the scenic beauty of the Carrickfinn/Braade area."

Dungloe SWIMMING POOL

Swimming Pool Saga Continues

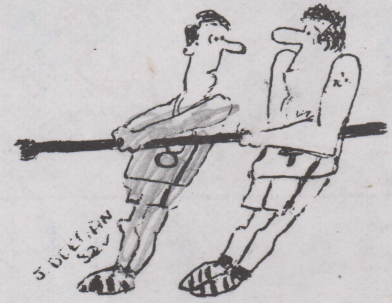
The swimming pool in Óstán na Rosann, Dungloe (the only heated one in the area) has closed again after being re-opened to the public for a brief few months during the summer. It now seems that the North West Swimming Association which collected a lot of money from schools, businesses and individuals, and which have been seeking for a long time to lease the pool will not in fact be doing so, and if the pool is to open again it will be operated by Óstán na Rosann themselves.

There is considerable annoyance locally by members of the public who have paid money a long time ago and who do not see any signs of getting a return for it. Certain groups - including a Dungloe Youth Club have also complained that although they offered to pay the quoted price for an hourly session the pool was still not made available to them. Ironically, some groups are again travelling the long journey to Letterkenny swimming pool every week.

We spoke to the hotel Manager who told us that unfortunately because of the high cost of heating the pool they would need to have at least four groups per day using the pool to justify opening it. He said that some schools in the area had been approached to see if they would be interested but that they had not yet got a firm enough response from enough interested parties. He was optimistic however that the pool could open by January.

Let's hope he's right. A swimming pool is vitally important to this community.

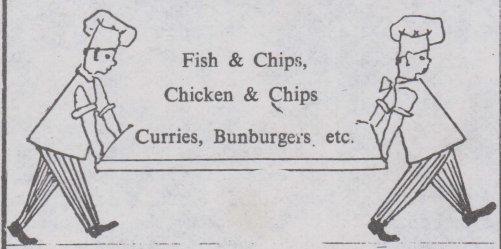

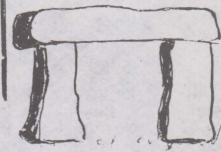

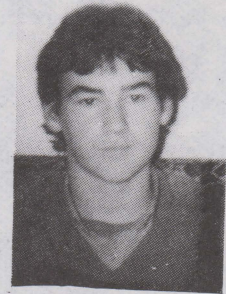
