The one ray of hope for the islanders and their sole connection with authority and officialdom has always been the Catholic Church, but more particularly the resident curate.

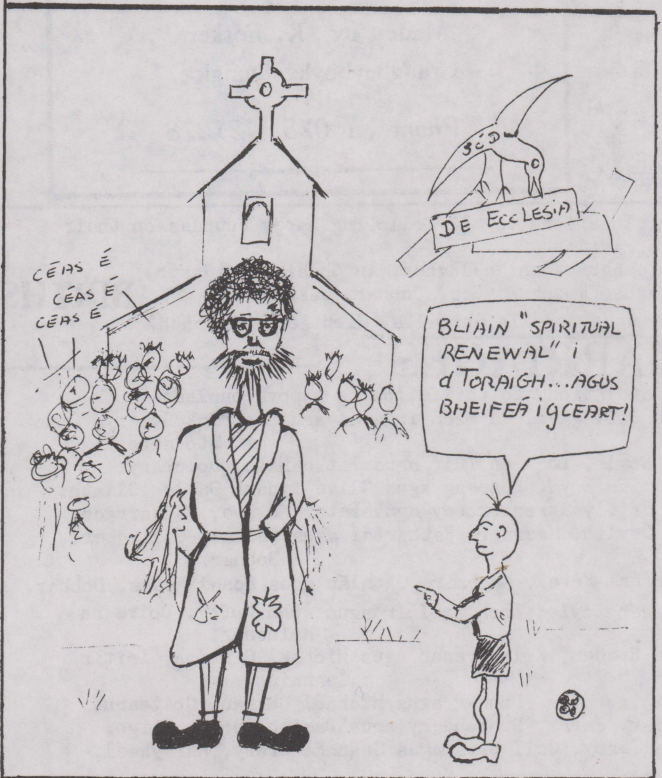

In the past it has been generally assumed that cigarette smokers harm only themselves, but in recent years a considerable body of evidence has been collected which demonstrates the harmful effects of passive smoking.

Surely the time has come when the rights of the non-smokers to breathe unpolluted air should be held to be greater than the rights of the smoker to pollute the non-smoker.

The proportion of men aged 35 who will die before reaching retirement age (65) is 40% for heavy (25+ daily) smokers, compared with only 15% for non-smokers.

Out of 1,000 young smokers about one will be murdered, about six will be killed on the roads and about 250 will die before their time as a result of cigarette smoking.

Ninety per cent of all deaths from chronic bronchitis and emphysema and 25% of all deaths from ischaemic heart disease are attributable to smoking.

As many as 50 million working days are lost in industry every year as a consequence of cigarette smoking in Britain.

In one study it was noted that male and female smokers who smoked more than 20 cigarettes a day lost about twice as much time from work as non-smokers. In another study, student nurses in Britain who smoke were shown to have about two and a half times as many days off work as non-smoking nurses.

Smoking related diseases make a large contribution to the present problems of the health service both by increasing demand and also by its effects on our staff. It can be assumed that if there is a reduction in smoking-related disease, a generally healthier population would get speedier treatment in the limited resources available.

A number of studies have shown that smokers are often distracted from their work by lighting and smoking cigarettes and have poorer task performance than non-smokers. For

example, there is one observation study which suggested that workers smoking 30 cigarettes a day for a month were distracted from their work for 17 hours.

One study showed the total accident rate was more than twice as high among smokers as among non-smokers and other studies have shown the excess car accident rate in smokers, compared to non-smokers.

Twenty per cent of all fires occurring in industrial premises were due to smoking materials.

Carelessly stubbed out cigarette ends, tobacco ash, burnt carpets, dirty walls, smelly curtains, are just a few of the things that should be costed in an attempt to assess the cost to industry of smoking.

The majority of the population are now non-smokers and it is interesting to note the decline in smoking which has occurred in the last few years.

The majority of the population now seek either a ban on smoking or at least separate areas for smokers and non-smokers in many situations.

Cheap Energy From S. America's 62-Story Dam

• It's the sheer size of Itaipu Dam, more than anything else, that is so astounding to visitors.

There is enough concrete in this dam on the border between Brazil and Paraguay to rebuild the entire city of Boston. The main part of the dam is 62 stories high, taller than any other building in South America. Its lake would cover more than half of Luxembourg. Once it is working at full capacity, the power generated in just one hour by Itaipu could keep a 60-watt light bulb burning for 24,000 years.

But these statistics don't awe the Brazilians and Paraguayans who helped build Itaipu nearly as much as what Itaipu stands for. Itaipu was built almost entirely by South Americans.

This is the cause of a great deal of national pride on both sides of the border. "We are

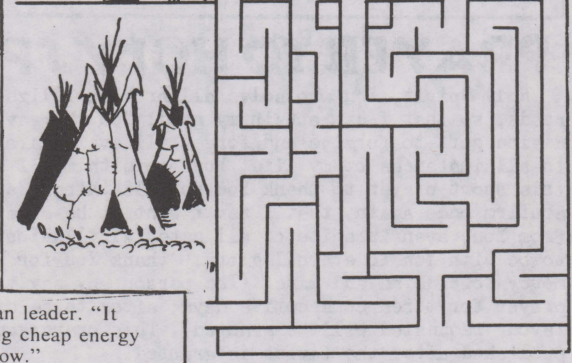
building for the future," says one Brazilian construction worker. "Itaipu is exciting, because you know you're building your country." One Paraguayan said, "This dam has been a dream for years."

The head of the project, Brazilian Jose Costa Cavalcanti, feels that Itaipu puts an end to the myth that South Americans need foreign know-how. "This shows we are capable."

The first of Itaipu's turbines started generating electricity last month. By 1986, all 18 generators will be installed, giving the dam the ability to produce 12,600 megawatts of power, more than twice as much as the next largest dam, the Grand Coulee in the state of Washington.

People are already looking far beyond the 1986 completion. "It's a magnificent investment,"

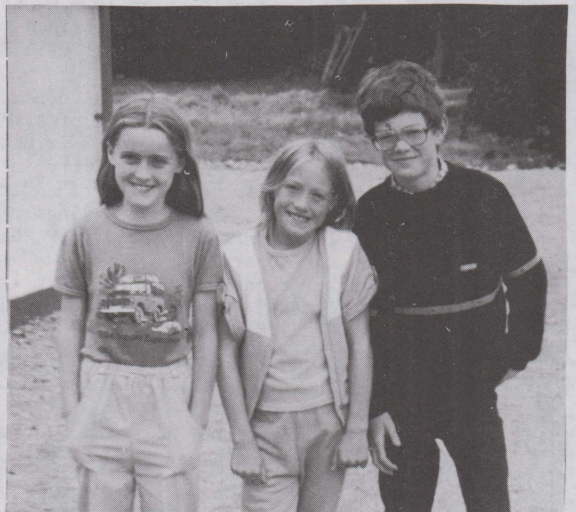

The senior and most royal family of the Cíneal Conaill is how the Gallaghers or O'Gallaghers are described by the great Irish scholar and historian Dr. J. O'Donovan. The Cíneal Conaill was the race of Conal Gulban, son of Niall of the Nine Hostages who were seated in Tirconaill and included the families of O'Donnells, MacSweeneys, O'Boyles, O'Dohertys, and O'Maoldónaidh.

The Irish name Ó Gallchobhair derives from the word "Gall" (foreign) and "Cobhair" (help). The firsts to bear the name Gallchobhair was a direct descendant of Callach, King of Ireland 642 to 654. Callach was the son of Maolchobha, Ard Ri 612-615. From the latter came the name Maolcara which was so popular as a christian name among the O'Gallachobhairs in olden times.

The Royal line goes back further to Aodh, Ard Ri 572-599, and Aimmire, Monarch of Ireland 568-571. Aimmire was third in descent from Conal Gulban, son of Niall of the Nine Hostages.

The Gallaghers held land in the present baronies of Tirhugh and Raphoe; a more detailed description states: "In the long years between the 5th and 17th Centuries Clan Ua Gallchobhair held lands that lie between Kilbarrow and Assaroe on the South West, extending along the coast to Lough Erne. They also possessed other lands to the North West of the present town of Mountcharles, reaching along the sea to Killaghtee and northward to Killymard and up as far as the hills which form the boundary line of Lower Killybegs.

From the 15th Century the Gallaghers were hereditary marshalls and Commanders of Cavalry to O'Donnell, and in an account of Shane (the Proud) O'Neill's visit to the Court of England he was accompanied by his marshall O'Gallchobhair.

Because of their kinship to the princely house of O'Donnell the affairs of Clan O Gallchobhair were set out in great detail in the Annals of the Four Masters. After the flight of O'Donnell and O'Neill, the native Irish Civilisation in Ulster and all that it stood for collapsed, and with it disappeared the hereditary historians of the Province.

The only available records of the O'Gallaghers in subsequent centuries are mostly of an ecclesiastical nature. Macára O'Gallchobhair, Abbot of St. Adamnan's Shrine died in 1022. In 1188 the son of O'Gallchobhair was slain near Assaroe while fighting against the O'Connors of Connacht, who invaded Tír Chonaill. Loughlin O'Gallagher, Dean of Raphoe was made Bishop of that See in 1420 until his death in 1438. In 1431 the O'Donnells and O'Gallaghers quaralled. Conal O'Donnell invaded Tirhugh and was slain by the O'Gallaghers. In 1450 two prominent scions of the clan died. Donagh O'Gallagher, Abbot of Raphoe and the "Bishop" O'Gallagher, who was a very powerful man in the clan. O'Donnell writes: "This man Laurence O'Gallagher, Bishop of Raphoe, of whom strange stories were told. O'Donnell for one offence destroyed his castle and put him on trial before the Private of Ireland.

In 1513 during O'Donnells absence in Connacht Owen O'Malley, with three ships came into the harbour at Killybegs at night and plundered the town. A storm prevented him from re-embarking and he had to remain in the town. The news spread, then the Gallaghers and McSweeneys arrived with their forces, killing O'Malley and recovering the plunder.

Many of the O'Gallaghers were killed in the great battle in which the whole nation - both Irish and Anglo-Irish - took part in 1522, between the O'Neills and O'Donnells. Tuathal Ballah O Gallagher, one of the most powerful of the chiefs of Tír Chonaill died in 1451. It is related that consequent on a vow taken in his youth he never killed a man in battle. His usual practice was to disarm his opponent and make him a prisoner and the Four Masters say that he never came out of battle without prisoners.

Edward O Gallagher, son of Brian Bishop of Raphoe died in 1543.

The year 1543 seems to have been a lively one for the Clan O'Donnell put Cahir, the son of Donal Balbh and the Clan Hugh O'Gallaghers in charge of the Castle of Lifford but they set about making their own of it and evicted the O'Donnell people.

O'Donnell came to Lifford to assert his authority and found that some of the McSweeneys had allied themselves with the O'Gallaghers. O'Donnell was beaten in the attack on the castle and Feardorcha O'Gallagher was captured. He was held as a hostage for the surrender of the castle which took place after the killing of Cahir O'Gallagher. The O'Gallaghers figure continuously in violent activities involving the O'Donnells and the O'Neills during the rest of the 16th Century. Redmond O'Gallagher, Bishop of Derry fought the English in 1601 and in 1602 O'Gallagher gave up the castle at Ballymore which he had held for Red Hugh O'Donnell. The last reference in the annals to O'Gallagher are found under the year 1603, when it stated that Owen, son of Feardorcha, was slain in an invasion of Breifne. Phelim and James Gallagher obtained grants of land in Connacht under the operation of the Acts of Grace in the reign of Charles II. Between 1420-1638 there were eight O'Gallagher - Bishops of Raphoe and one Bishop of Derry.

Louis O'Gallagher was made Vicar General of Raphoe in 1683. Redmond O'Gallagher was empowered by the Pope in 1575 to exercise Jurisdiction in the diocese of Armagh during the absence of the Primate and O'Sullivan Beara in his Catholic History refers to him as Vice - Primate of Ireland. For many years he was in hiding before he was eventually captured and executed near Derry in 1601.

In 1803 Napoleon ordered the formation of an Irish Legion in which Patrick Gallagher served as a captain. In the American Civil War Michael and James Gallagher were officers in Meagher's Irish Brigade.

In the early part of the present century Dr. Nicholas Gallagher was Bishop of Galveston in America and John Gallagher Bishop of Goaltoun in Australia.

Fr. Hugh P. Gallagher became leader of Irish Priests and congregations in the Western States of America and started the Church of the Immaculate Conception in Oakland California. He also helped build St. Mary's Cathedral in San Francisco, and in 1883 he founded the Catholic Standard, the first Catholic newspaper on the West Coast. He was also the founder of St. Mary's Hospital in San Francisco. Michael James Gallagher was bishop of Grand Rapids in Detroit.

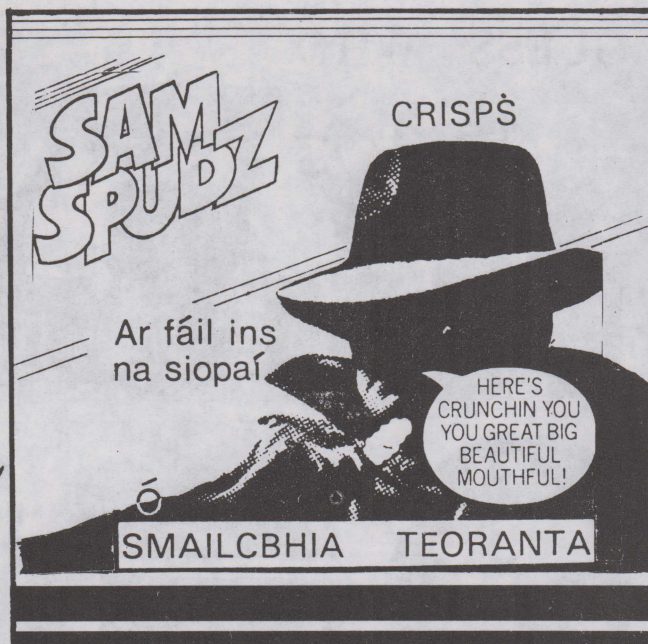

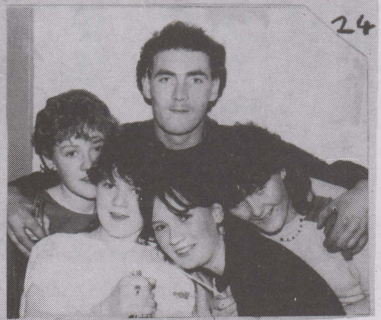
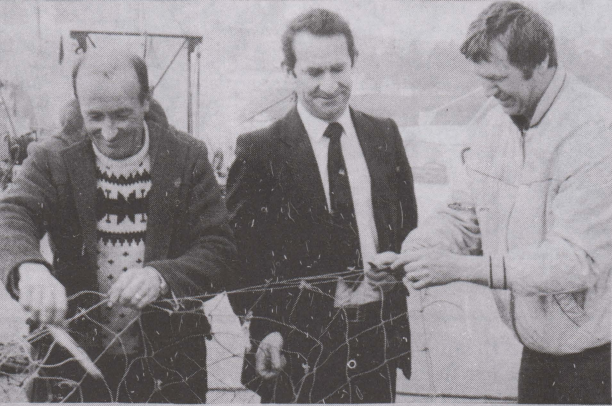
