## CARRICKFIN AIR RALLY

Donegal's first ever Air Rally will take place at Carrickfin, Annagry during the weekend of July 9th, 10th and 11th. It is being organised by the West Donegal Air Club Limited and this novel event is expected to attract huge crowds to the area. The Carrickfin flying club, although still in its infancy have already acquired 2 aircraft, have over 20 student pilots and are attached to the Airline Owners & Pilot's Association or A.O.P.A. whose Vice-President, Pat Nolan from Kilkenny will open the rally.

The importance of the Carrickfin rally is significant when you consider that O.A.P.A. who run 10 or 11 rallies throughout Ireland, are marking it as their main event of 1982. It is expected that 50 or 60 aircraft will converge on the little Rosses airstrip from all over Ireland (North & South), as well as from Britain and the Channel Islands.

Obviously such an event requires a great deal of planning and a big committee have been busy over the last few months organising and taking care of every little detail. Club P.R.O., James Hemmings tells me that they have received excellent co-operation from the community, the garda síochana and the local land-owners, while Udaras na Gaeltachta who own the airstrip have been extremely helpful. During the weekend there will be various entertainments organised in the Rosses and Gaoth Dobhair including, Wind Surfing, Scuba-Diving, Sea and Fresh Water Angling, Trawler trips to the Islands, etc. in conjunction with the rally.

Director of the Rally, Dr. Peter Sweeney, Director of Aviation Neil Bracken and all the committee are hoping it will turn out to be a gala weekend for participants and the public and that mother nature will be kind and provide us with good weather.

Eight new thatched cottages are near completion on Cruit Island. So far this seems to be a successful venture as all of them are booked as holiday homes up until the end of September.

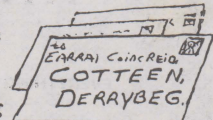

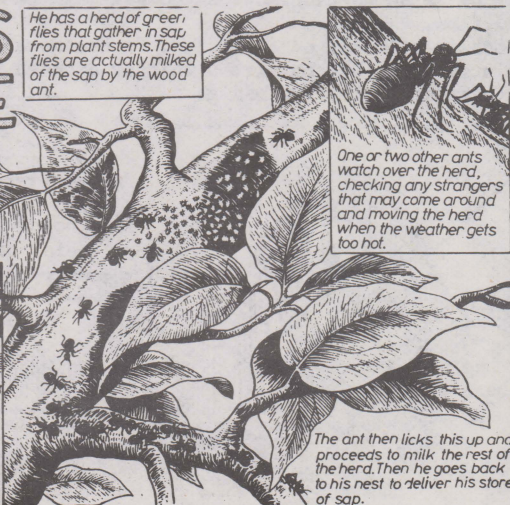
He has a herd of green flies that gather in sap from plant stems. These flies are actually milked of the sap by the wood ant.

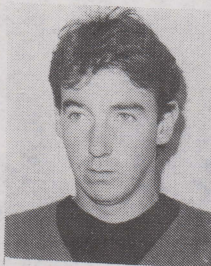



Reading "Guth 7 Tuairim" a few months ago I wasn't surprised to see you writing your Eagaralt about the 28 year old U.D.R. man who was shot dead by the Provisional I.R.A. I share your views when you condemn this act, (I personally don't accept violence of any description) but what annoys me considerably is that when Catholics are murdered by the U.D.A., U.V.F., British Army, Third Force and all other forces you don't write one line in your Guth 7 Tuairim about those people. I do not know your theory for this, but if you have an answer for it, I'd like to know it. When Bernadette Mc Aliskey and her husband were mowed down in front of their children, there wasn't one word in your paper about it. There are many other cases that are too numerous to mention. Last year when 10 hunger strikers starved to death (the worst death known to man), and all during the hunger strike, "Guth 7 Tuairim" didn't mention one word about them - oh sorry, "Guth 7 Tuairim" threw plenty of dirt at the Irish People who went out to support the hunger strikers. The great propanganda word "intimidation" was used - you alleged that shops had to be closed because of intimidation.
