Donegal's first ever Air Rally will take place at Carrickfin, Annagry during the weekend of July 9th, 10th and 11th. During the weekend there will be various entertainments organised in the Rosses and Gaoth Dobhair including, Wind Surfing, Scuba - Diving, Sea and Fresh Water Angling, Trawler trips to the Islands, etc. in conjunction with the rally.


