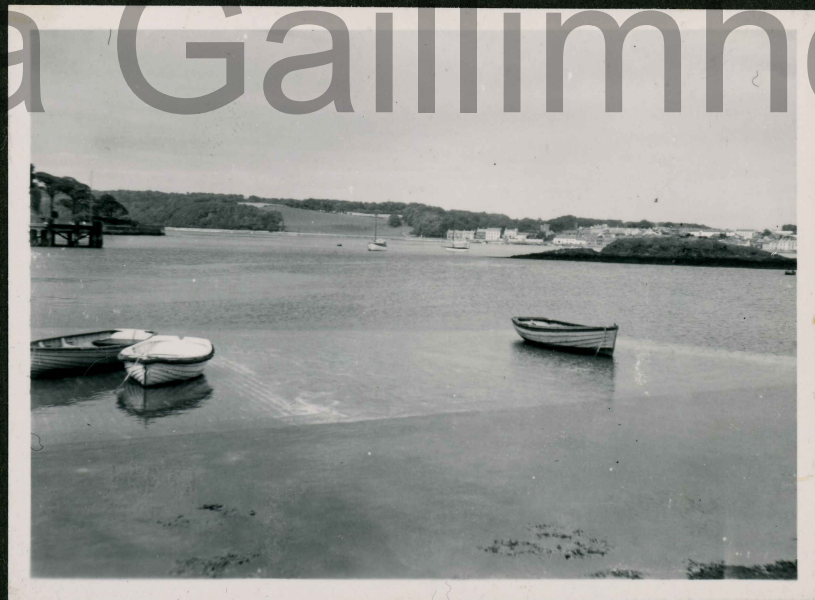

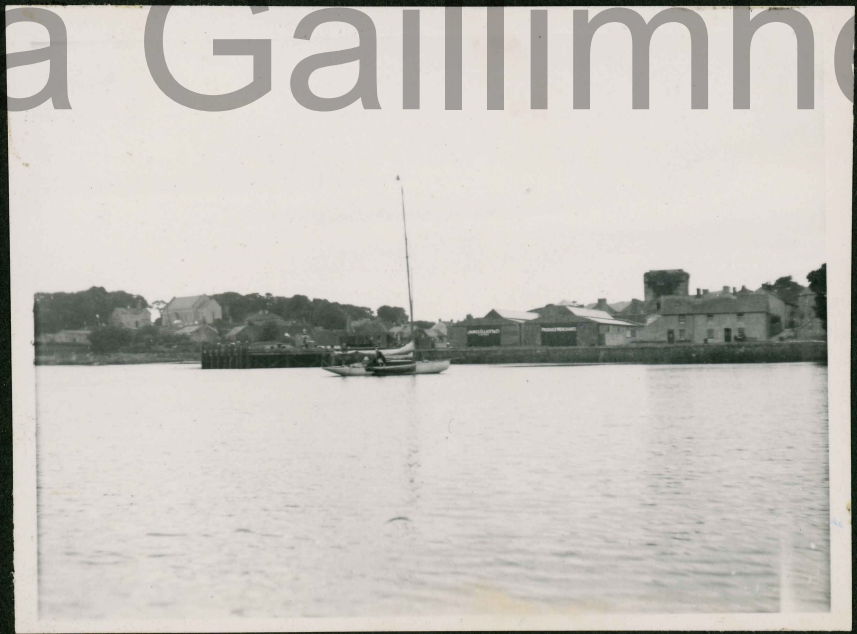

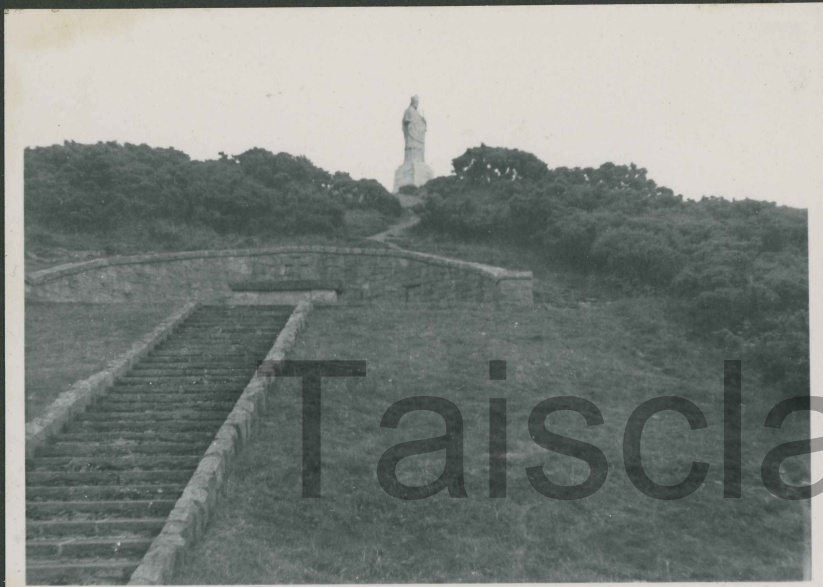

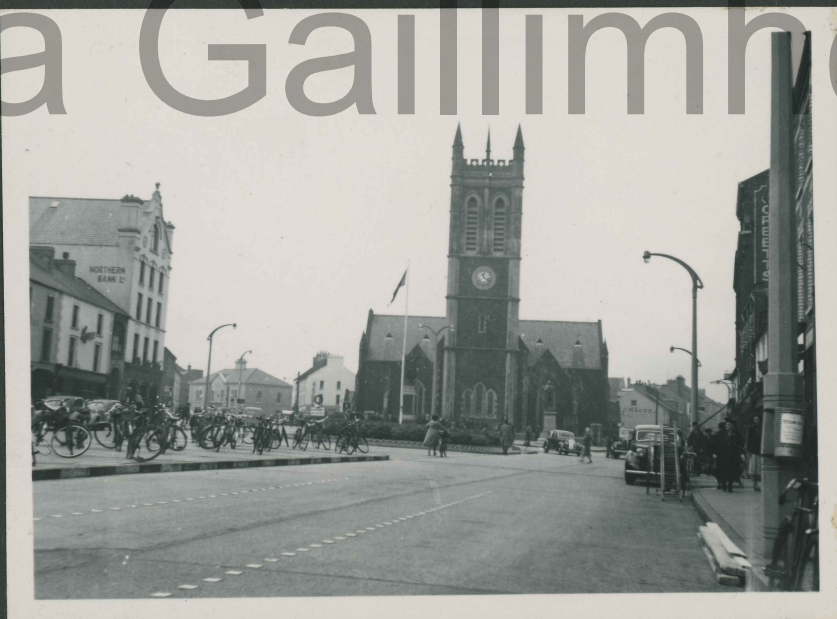

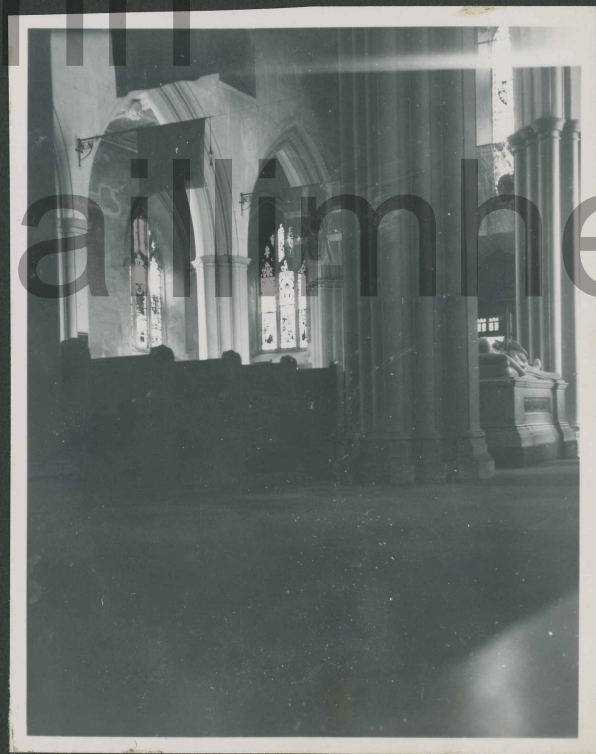

of the 19th centenary of his landing



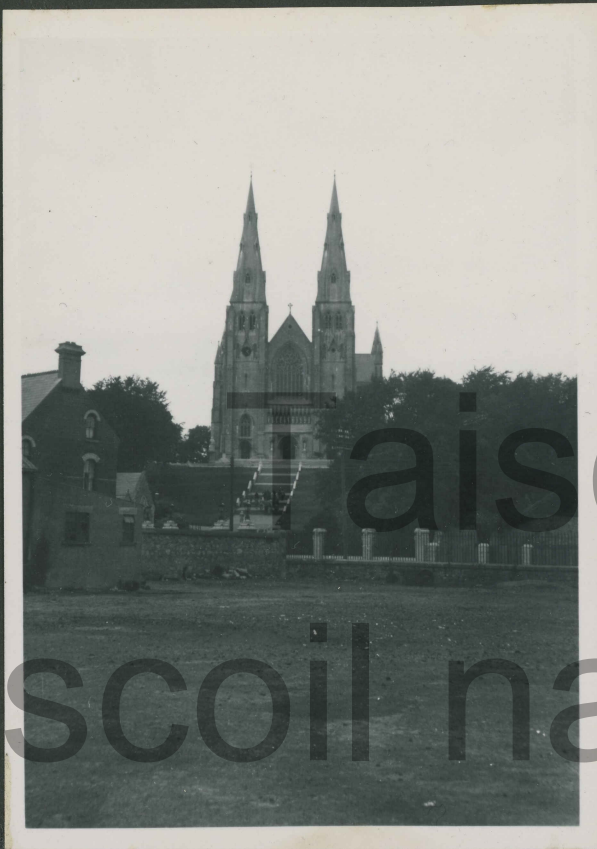

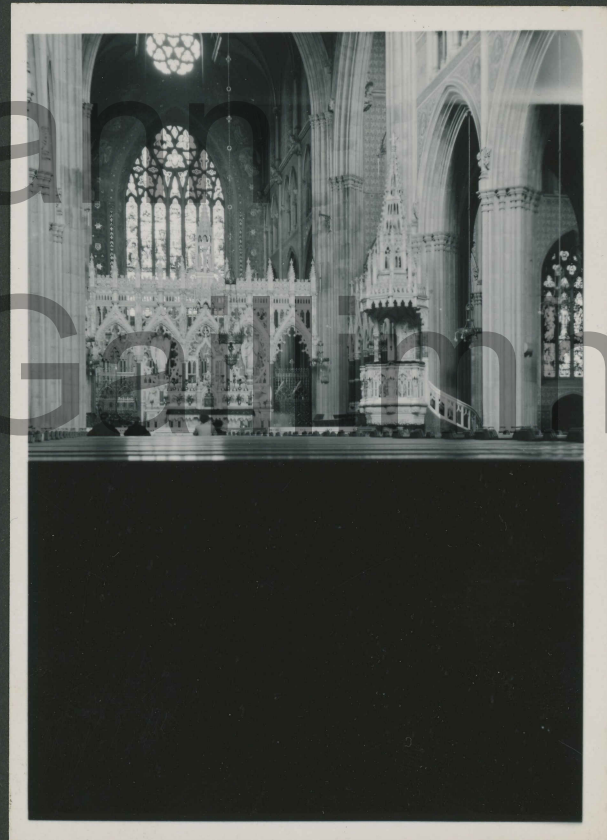
