All pupils from third standard and upwards who have not earned fees for Irish before may be entered for the "first year's course," which, as shewn, may consist either of Anthony O'Doherty's books or Craig's. Those who have earned fees before should be entered for the second year's course or the third or fourth, according to the number of times fees have been earned by them. The half-hour before roll call is to be regarded as outside the "fixed" school hours. and hence Irish can be taught during this time for National teachers should make a note of fees.
