To The Officer Commanding  
3rd Battalion Royal Inniskillings Fusiliers,  
at Londonderry,

Sir,

I have to request that my son, No. ~~121~~<sup>28,127</sup>,  
Private James O'Doherty, Company 5, be discharged from  
military service on the following grounds: —

- 1°. He has joined without my knowledge or consent,  
acting on a boyish freak of which he already repents.
- 2°. He is under the Regulation military age of 18 years,  
as shown by the accompanying Birth Certificate. (Enclosure 1).
- 3°. Though on a casual examination he may appear to  
be medically fit, he is really not so, as he has always been  
subject to a weakness of the ankles of the right foot  
owing to a hurt received in infancy. On any severe  
exertion, such as a football game, a long walk, or even  
a prolonged spell of standing, this weakness shows  
itself in swelling, stiffness, slight discolouration, and  
pain of the ankles. It will, I am certain, quite unfit  
him for the severer exercises of military drill, route  
marching, &c.

- 4°. His teaching help is indispensable to me for  
the successful carrying out of my school work,  
especially at this season of the year when country  
schools hereabouts are overcrowded with an inrush  
of

of children who are engaged at farm-work during the other seasons.

5°. On his appointment as Monitor he signed an Agreement whereby he bound himself to fit himself thoroughly for and to follow the occupation of Teacher, thus placing himself in the relation of Apprentice to the Commissioners of National Education for a period of three years, only a half year of which has yet elapsed. Draft form of Agreement herewith. (Enclosure 2).

6°. He is my only son at home, with the exception of a child of three years of age; and as such his help is absolutely necessary to me in farm-work and other subsidiary means for the maintenance of my family.

I trust that, on proper consideration of the foregoing facts, the Authorities will allow the lad to return to his civilian life and duties.
